Telehealth Technologies 2007 Summit held



Industry leaders, clinicians, company management and staff, Congressional staff and the military gathered for a four-day summit at Caring Technologies' headquarters in Boise, ID. The event, sponsored by the National Institute of Child & Human Development (NICHD) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Autism Speaks and the Doug Flutie Jr. Foundation, generated valuable feedback

and strong cross-discipline discussion and recognition for the company. Highlights included an open house with a tour of the company's new offices, round-table discussions, presentations by guests and company personnel, and product demonstrations. Some topics covered were: the education market, online health opportunities, the status of all three aims of the company's \$1 million NICHD grant, the Dept. of Defense's data systems, health IT security, BI Capture™ hardware, software and commercialization, and online training.

CT exhibits at national conferences

The company was an exhibitor and presenter at the American Telemedicine Association's first Mid-Year Meeting in Las Vegas on September 17-18, the Network of Autism Training and Technical Assistance Programs (NATTAP) conference on September 26-28 in Columbus, OH, and the Closing the Gap technology conference in Minneapolis on October 16-18.
