### CT Sponsors Special Olympics 2009 World Games

Caring Technologies was a sponsor of the Special Olympics International 2009 World Winter Games, February 7-13, 2009, in Boise, ID. Over 3,000 athletes represented 80 countries, and U.S. Vice President Joe Biden and Education Secretary Arne Duncan were on hand to reaffirm the Obama Administration's commitment to the concerns of the disability community. CT was particularly proud to support the Special Olympics' Healthy Athletes Program, which has screened more than 700,000 athletes for health problems across seven disciplines since 1997.

### CEO speaks at TalkAutism-sponsored NATTAP Conference

Caring Technologies CEO Ron Oberleitner spoke at the NATTAP (Network of Autism Training & Technical Assistance Programs) 2008 Conference in Columbus, OH on November 18, 2008. ### Easter Seals National Director visits CT
