## Company gets \$1 million grant for autism care

A Boise company has received a \$1 million grant from the National Institutes of Health for Autism to help with its development of a video recording system that lets professionals, caregivers and parents uniquely capture and then securely replay the last few moments before a behavior of interest or concern of a child with autism.

Caring Technologies/TalkAutism of Boise collaborated with Georgia Institute of Technology to develop the system.

Ron Oberleitner, CEO and co-founder of Caring Technologies, said such imaging can help families and teachers even in the most rural communities get access to specialists.

Oberleitner, whose son has autism, also founded Talkautism.com, a Web community deemed "best of the Web" by Forbes for parents and professionals to exchange information.
